Nestled in the woods of Maryville College is a place where you seem to go back in time and forget the hustle and bustle of daily life. This place, known as the RT Lodge, has quite the eclectic history (from the original owner, Ms. Susan Wiley Walker, building Morningside in 1932) to the HCHNA's own Tom and Nan Taylor operating a restaurant there. It is currently owned by Ruby Tuesday, Inc., who acquired the property in 1997 to restore it and bring it back to its former glory. With its warm and cozy décor, it now serves as a popular corporate retreat as well as an in demand wedding location.

On Monday, December 18, the RT Lodge hosted an event for the College Hill neighborhood, showcasing not only their facilities, but also a sampling of their delicious food. All meat is locally raised and many of the cheeses are also produced in the surrounding communities.

Welcome New Neighbors to the HCHNA!


It is with great pleasure that we introduce the following new neighbors to our Historic College Hill Neighborhood.
