This Crafsman-influenced home is a two-story frame, gable front, built circa 1920. This house has a brick foundation, gable roof of composition shingles, and exterior brick chimney and weatherboard siding. The main entrance has a small shed roof awning with knee-brack sidelights. On the east façade is a one-story screened porch with square posts. The current owners have decorated the interior of the house with Victorian antiques, combining the richness of that era with the more current Crafsman style. The result is stunning! As is true with many Victorian homes, multiple prints were often used in a highly ornate fashion. This house features "over the top" wall coverings of Bradbury & Bradbury historic wallpapers. In the dining room alone, fourteen patterns were used on the walls and ceiling.
