This Victorian Farm House, known as the Goddard House, is so typical of the era. Over the years, it has been a single-family residence with the exception of the 1960's when it was a living facility for Maryville College women. Updating and modification have occurred over the years to suit the needs of each resident family. The Kings, since 1987, have endeavored to maintain ambiance and style of the house as it might have been in the early 1900's. The dining room features a spooled gingerbread arch that mirrors the etched glass window above the front door. The entire house has antique furnishings and accessories with the idea of preserving the dignity of a lifestyle of over 110 years ago. Recently they have added the upper porch to the home with was removed before they purchased house. Also, they have changed the color from a mustard yellow to white.
