Built in 1915, this 1½ story Craftsman-style Bungalow directly faces the Maryville College football field and gymnasium, which are named in honor of the coaches – Lombe Honaker and Boydson Baird- who resided in the house 1921-1959 and 1959-2002, respectively. One of the current owners is a professor at Maryville College, like so many who live in the district. Typical of the Craftsman Bungalow, the house has a prominent front porch and Porte Cochere that are framed by brick pillar posts and a front-facing gabled roof with a low, wide dormer. In 2007, extensive renovations were completed, including updated plumbing, new electrical wiring and period light fixtures, repairs to all 6/1 vertical sash windows, return of ceilings to original height, and repair and refinishing of the original heart-of-pine and oak floors.

In bungalow tradition, the floor plan features an open layout with numerous windows. The living room fireplace is a design focal point and features a refinished wooden fireplace mantel, wood-burning stove, and fireplace surrounded by natural stone. French doors separate the living room and study, which has built-in bookshelves. A downstairs bedroom has been converted into a master bedroom, closet and bathroom with a unique barrel-vaulted, tiled ceiling. Enclosed attic windows in the rear of the house have been exposed and incorporated into an open stairwell and upstairs balcony. Interior finish materials-paint colors, flooring, tile, and art-glass—were selected to blend craftsman aesthetics and contemporary amenities.
