ANNUAL HCHNA MEETING SUMMARY

On Saturday, January 18, the annual HCHNA meeting was held at Southern Grace Coffee Company. Behind the City building It was one of the most widely attended annual meeting to date.

During the meeting, updates were provided to residents by the Treasurer, Membership Chair, Welcome Chair and Newsletter Chair. Board position vacancies were also nominated and voted on; the Board added three new members:

- Social Chair Susan Mills
- Members at Large Bond Almand and Ann Tedford

Additionally, Jeff McNaughton was officially voted in as the new Treasurer, converting from his role as Acting. Treasurer.

Kelly Duggan, Senior Planner for the City of Maryville as well as Kevin Stoltenberg, the City Engineer, also attended the meeting to provide updates on a variety of topics that interest the HCHNA. Kelly spoke about living in a historic district and also the process for getting changes to homes approved through the Historic Zoning Commission. She also discussed the benefits to living in a historic district. Next, Kevin presented the current plans for the Montvale Road expansion. The current extension includes sidewalks on both sides of Montvale as well as increasing the number of lanes to accommodate a center turning lane. Ideas were discussed for ensuring children can safely get across Montvale for school and what the neighborhood would like to see with respect to access to keep us from being isolated.

Overall, it was a great meeting with a plethora of information exchanged!

With the start of the new year, the HCHNA Board decided to start some new activities in an ef-

UPDATES ON COVID-19

As we find ourselves in the midst of one of the largest Public Health crises, it is important to remember that we as a community will get through this. The HCHNA Board is prepared to assist any resident with special needs and requests during this self-quarantine. If you need anything during this time (i.e., groceries, household items, errands run or assistance with your child's school work), please look for the Mutual Aid information packet and questionnaire that is scheduled to be delivered to your house in the next week..

In the meantime, please adhere to the CDC recommendations to help "flatten the curve" and the spread of the virus:

 Wash Hands Often – use soap and water and scrub for at least 20 seconds (especially after being in a public place or following blowing your nose or coughing)

- If you cannot wash your hands, use hand sanitizer composed of at least 60% alcohol to clean your hands.
- Avoid touching your nose, eyes and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with those who are sick.
- Practice social distancing, which provides you leave at least 6 feet between people in public places (i.e., grocery stores, Post Offices, etc.)
- If you feel sick or are running a fever, stay home; due to the long incubation period associated with this virus, you can be asymptomatic for up to 14 days (during which you can infect others).
- Clean and disinfect surfaces readily touched often – this in-

cludes appliance handles, soap dispensers, door knobs, mailboxes, fence gates, etc.

While any registered disinfectant will work for minimizing exposure and spread of COVID-19, you can also make a disinfectant with chemicals you probably have at home. Options include:

- Bleach Solution
- ⇒ Mix 5 tablespoons of bleach per gallon of water
- ⇒ Mix 4 teaspoons per quart of water
- Alcohol solutions
- \Rightarrow Ensure solution contains at least 70% alcohol.

During this pandemic, please be safe, healthy and look after one another. If you need any assistance, please do not hesitate to reach out for it.
