LOOSE DOGS

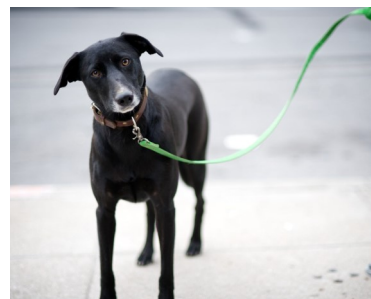
Recently, there has been a rash of loose dogs in the neighborhood. While many dogs (or their owners) are recognized by those that walk throughout the district and are friendly, every once in awhile a dog not known to anyone may be seen in the Historic District.

An incident occurred in early May where a neighborhood dog was attacked by another dog that got loose. The dog that was attacked required stitches in her muscle, shoulder and

leg. Therefore, if you see a loose dog in the neighborhood and do not know its owners, please call Animal Control at (865) 681-2241. Do not try to corral or chase the dog.

Also, please be aware that there is a leash law within the city limits of Maryville; your dog should be on a leash when outside of your home and off your property. It is a violation of Maryville City Code 10-203 to allow your dog to roam without a leash when outside.

Adhering to these regulations will allow everyone to enjoy our beautiful district without the fear of an encounter with a loose dog.



TRASH REMINDERS

As many of us have been inside during the quarantine and have been cleaning out closets and rooms, please remember that while cleaning is cathartic, be mindful of where and how you dispose of trash.

Trash is collected weekly on Friday mornings; you can move your trash can out to the curb on Thursday afternoon/evening prior to Friday collection. Trash cans should not remain at the curb and be

brought back to the house following trash collection. All trash must be in a designated can; the trash is collected by a truck with a mechanic arm; therefore, any trash not in a can will not be picked up weekly.



Please also remember that bulk trash is collected by the city monthly during the week of the 15th. You should only bring bulk waste curbside 3 days prior to pickup; therefore, it is your responsibility to store the waste off the curb until the week of the 15th.

Adhering to these regulations ensures the neighborhood is safe and clean for everyone.

CHANGES TO HCHNA MEMBERSHIP

The HCHNA is a neighborhood social club that comes together to positively impact the neighborhood we all call home; the Association sponsors food trucks, a fall gathering, a community yard sale and the Fourth of July flags and Christmas luminaries among other annual events. However, in order to continue activities and make positive contributions to the Historic District, we need members.

In the past couple of years, the HCHNA has seen a reduction in the number of households paying annual membership dues of \$35. In an effort to increase both membership and participation in the neighborhood, the Board has discussed efforts to increase participation; these efforts include reducing the membership dues to \$25, allowing households to contribute any monetary amount to the association and providing various means to pay dues (i.e., PayPal, Venmo, square, etc.). The Board would just like to get more people involved in their community as this makes the neighborhood stronger.
